

# Supply List - Michele's Classes

Canvas or canvas boards 6x8 or 8x10 for a beginner, or what you are comfortable with.

Brushes # 2, #4, #6, and # 8 filberts/flat any combination - if buying new brushes I recommend Signet by Robert Simmons.

If you have brushes bring what you have to the first class before buying new ones.

## Paper Towels

Oil Paint - Turpenoid - (odorless turpentine) and small container to put it in.

Metal can with clasps seem to work the best

Acrylics- bring larger container for water.

## Palette Paper

There are plastic boxes that hold the palette paper. For acrylic get one with a sponge in it to help keep your paints moist.

Paint - Oil or acrylics (If using acrylics buy a medium to extend the working time/ palette with sponge bottom helps keep the paint moist.

## Colors

Titanium white - (if you have a white already bring that one)

Ultramarine blue -deep

Cad yellow light

Alizarin crimson

Cadmium orange

Yellow ochre

Cobalt blue

(Phalo green, black-optional)

Bring any other colors you may have.

There is professional and student grade paint – you'll have to decide what you want to invest in.

If you are a beginner and are just trying painting to see if you like it- beginner kits can be cheaper. I always find it difficult to find everything I need at one store. You can try Dick Blick, Utrecht in Mpls., or Michaels.

For Plein Air Class-You need a comfortable set up for outside, easel, chair or small table if you want. We can discuss easels at the first class.
