



Virginia Buck (A, B, C) received her B.A. in Art History from Hamline University. Virginia helps students tap into their own way of creating. She works individually with students to facilitate growth of artistic talents. Her classes teach fundamental techniques and genres within a historical context and perspective.



Group A: Art Camps for Ages 5 - 6

There are three weeks of art camps for children ages 5-6, with complete planning flexibility within these weeks.

June 25-29 | July 23-27 | August 6-10

Art camps for this age group focus on single-class projects to hold attention, challenge without frustration and provide happy outcomes and pride in finished projects. Solid skills are taught that become building blocks for future work.

Because our youngest artists have different needs and interests, camps are sold separately so families may combine them in any way to best fit each child's needs and work with the family schedule. You may register for half- or full days as many times a week as desired (from one to 10 classes per week).

Plan carefully before registering to avoid fees for making changes later on (cancellation details on page 11). Please provide a snack and beverage for each class, plus a bag lunch and beverage for lunch for full-days. Food may be purchased at the Art Center Café.

PAINTING VAN GOGH

(1 class)

Dutch artist Vincent van Gogh (1853-1890) painted landscapes, still lifes and portraits known for their stunning colors and expressive brushstrokes. In the morning, you'll paint floral still life acrylic paintings with a bright, sunny color palette inspired by Van Gogh's Sunflowers masterpiece. In the afternoon, you'll draw, paint, and collage art inspired by Van Gogh's *The Starry Night*, where the night sky comes alive with stars. Enrollment limited to 16.

BEATRIX & PETER **RABBIT**

Beatrix Potter (1866-1943) was an English writer and illustrator who wrote The Tale of Peter Rabbit. She was a natural scientist who shared her love of the English countryside and its inhabitants through her illustrations. In the morning, you'll draw and paint Peter Rabbit and his garden escapades, and practice your observational drawing skills. In the afternoon, you'll sculpt your own rabbit out of clay, and then design its features like fur and perhaps its own blue jacket. Projects will be glazed and fired, and ready for pickup in three weeks. Note: Morning camp is limited to 16 and afternoon camp is limited to 12.
